HOW TO USE "5-NOTE TUNES"

5-NOTE TUNES may be used with any instrument, playing the songs in any key. The songs may be played by an individual player, or by a group of players. The purpose is to help each player gain confidence in playing "by ear" and also learn to get around easily in any key. Playing these tunes also works well as a warmup exercise for an individual player, or for a group.

To play the songs, first, play the major scale of the key in which you'd like to play the song. Then play the song, using the first five notes of the scale as indicated.

For pianists, note that the numbers correspond to the five fingers of the right hand. To play the tunes with the left hand, think of the numbers as referring to the scale tones, not the finger numbers.
